Sisters and Brothers,

Greetings in the Name of Jesus Christ, our Lord and Saviour.

I trust that this message finds you and your family well, as you journey through life. Remember that in life there will be bumps, hiccups and diversion; yet keep hold of God and His Son Jesus.

It is with extreme sadness that we note the murder of three young girls who were attending a holiday club dance workshop, in Southport on Monday 29th July. This occurred during the dance session (in broad daylight), by a 17 year old who took the life of Elsie Stancombe 7, Alice Augiar 9 and Bebe King 6. Others were also injured. We sometimes feel helpless, not knowing what we can do. If possible we can attend the vigils that are held. Remember, we can all pray for peace and strength.

'Fake' messages on social media also caused confusion and anger, that the murderer was an asylum seeker. This is incorrect. The 17 year old was born in Wales. A series of riots followed around the United Kingdom (UK), as the 'far right yobs' rioted and targeted immigration hotels, police and others. They were also trying to galvanize support and frighten many communities that they call immigrants (this is wrong). As Christians we must ensure that the truth is told, justice is done and we report those who are stirring up trouble, violence and division.

September is a time of new beginnings! For some it will be starting at a new university, college, school or nursery.
